Good Morning to everyone! We enjoyed a weekend off last week. I want to thank Tom Geddens for having shared last Sunday and for all the rest of you who made last Sunday's worship service a wonderful and blessed event. We missed the service and the first Sunday dinner with the Lunch Bunch. We look forward to that next month. This review of course is in reference to my last message from August 25th entitled "What Only Jesus can do for you". I referred briefly to Christ being the light of the world and that Christ brings light into our lives. Secondly, Christ is the life of GOD and He brings that life into our life as we develop relationships with Him. These two truths are very significant but I spent little time on them as I wanted to give much attention to the third aspect of what only Christ can do and that is that He is our lamb given to us by GOD. Ultimately, Christ is the supreme lamb of GOD that GOD gave that this lamb alone can redeem us from the curse of sin. So, Jesus alone can redeem us from our sins. When the scripture talks about Jesus being a lamb the truth of GOD's plan of redemption is one of the primary lessons we must learn that Jesus being a lamb is all about. The scripture from Genesis to Revelation will remind us of this truth. God alone can provide the lamb needed to redeem the human race from the curse of sin. GOD loved us so much that GOD was willing to address our sin problem because we simply cannot save ourselves. So when Jesus told Nicodemus in the John 3 discourse the ever popular statement now known as verse 16 Jesus was referring to much more than just the gift of himself from GOD the Father. Jesus wanted Nicodemus to understand in his heart and not just his head that "Hey Nicodemus, I'm the Lamb of GOD that your sacrificial system of religious observance has always pointed to! So when GOD gave me to the world, GOD had to lay me down on the brazen altar in the heavenly places to correct this sin mess the world created." This goes beyond our understanding of how deeply GOD loved His creation. Although, we cannot completely comprehend the sacrifice of GOD and Christ in the atonement it is to our benefit to more deeply see these truths. This will inspire us all the more to give ourselves to the service and devotion of Jesus Christ. We owed a debt we could never pay. He paid a debt he never owed. In this divine exchange Christ took on our temporal body and vulnerabilities to sin and we received access to all His glorious righteousness. Somehow this is really not fair to GOD but GOD was not looking for fair, GOD was looking for us and that is why Christ came and why Christ died and why Christ rose from the dead.
