When we dine with JESUS he gives us insight into the future, strength to face our future and the will power to go there in the event it should be difficult. Dining with JESUS is important!!! When is the last time you invited someone to the LORD's Supper? We know the next time it will be celebrated!



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## The Stewardship of Presence

We live in a very fast paced society, one in which our lives are compartmentalized: dad's playing golf, mom's going to aerobics, the kids or grandkids are in soccer, band, baseball, dance, school activities. In addition to all of this activity, we have the common responsibilities of life: work, school, shopping, medical appointments, domestic needs of home, car repairs, paying bills, and the list goes on.

We prioritize our choices of activity in the order of their value to us. We can't skip work, because we need the paycheck. We can't skip mom's birthday party because she will be hurt that we didn't come. However, it seems easy to "skip" church – because we had a busy week, we had things to do, we are tired and needed to sleep in. Such reasons are certainly true occasionally, but surely not every other week. One cannot avoid the fact that repeated absence from corporate worship is an indicator that something is not right with our spiritual life. Unfortunately we often choose to give up that which we need most.

Hebrews 10:23-25 says, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful; and let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another (NRSV)."

Think about those times when you go to Sunday school, the crowd is small, and people are absent. Isn't something missing? And what about those times when you walk into the sanctuary for worship and see "a lot of wood" rather than brothers and sisters in Christ? What do you feel? Where is everybody? What kind of testimony does this give? What message are we communicating? What are we saying to those who are visiting with us? None of us can be present all of the time, but we should acknowledge the need to practice the stewardship of presence. "Being there" is important. I wanted to share the words of a once popular sitcom theme song because I think it speaks to one of the words in Trinity's vision statement — connecting.

"Making your way in the world today takes everything you've got. Taking a break from all your worries, sure would help a lot. Wouldn't you like to get away?

Sometimes you want to go where everybody knows your name, and they're always glad you came.

You wanna be where you can see our troubles are all the same. You wanna be where everybody knows your name."

Let us resolve to make this day a new beginning. Let us <u>all</u> renew our commitment to being present in worship and in the lives of others. Let's all work to make Trinity one where we can minister and everybody knows that we are committed to becoming all that God wants us to be—together.

And also remembering Matthew 6:21 – "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."
