Last week's message was a simple challenge to keep our focus on what Christmas is really about which of course is the birth and presence and purpose of Jesus Christ! When we fail to keep that focus "our" Christmas celebration becomes part of the rat race pace of the way the "world" celebrates Christmas. So, we have the choice of rat race or GOD's Graced Holidays. Here are several very helpful tips to keep your holiday GOD graced instead of rat raced. First, make sure you celebrate whatever you know the LORD is doing in your life, church and His body so that your emphasis is more about how the light is right and moving forward rather than how the darkness is getting worse and has ruined Christmas. We should not live or think in denial about our problems and other issues, but cursing the darkness to the neglect of emphasizing and celebrating the power of GOD's light does not resolve any serious issue. It only highlights the problems and makes us feel worse about the issues more so than GOD ever intended. Secondly, do whatever you can do to bless someone else's situation and life this Christmas. This gift blesses them, you and your FATHER in heaven. There is something about doing for others that does more for us than can be explained to any skeptic about giving to others first instead of taking care of yourself first. This is part of the message of Christmas so let's all, within our possibilities, give to others as a part of celebrating Christmas. Thirdly, when you consider how the rodent the rat lives then ask GOD to give you the grace to not live and think in rat like ways as do some persons who miss the GOD purpose of Christmas. Christmas should never be more about how many parties we attended, gifts we gave or received, events we had to have, decorations we put up, additional money spent we didn't have, and a whole host of other imbalanced priorities than the celebration of the wonderful reality Christ is born, Christ is serving His purpose and Christ will return! May the HOLY SPIRIT give all of us balance in this Christmas season to keep JESUS the real reason for the holiday season! Blessings for the journey!!! Pastor Robert

Baptismal Service for

Kinsley Elizabeth Howard

December 8, 2013

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Dearly beloved, baptism is an outward and visible sign of the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, through which grace we become partakers of His righteousness and heirs of life eternal. Those receiving the sacrament are thereby marked as Christian disciples, and initiated into the fellowship of Christ's holy church. Our Lord has expressly given to little children a place among the people of God, which holy privilege must not be denied them. Remember the words of the Lord Jesus Christ, how he said, "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God." Through the sacrament of baptism we publicly declare and celebrate the work of God's grace already at work within the recipients of baptism. All this is God's gift, offered to us without price.

Bonnie Ramsey presents the candidate for baptism:

I present Kinsley Elizabeth Howard for baptism.

The pastor addresses the family of the candidate:

On behalf of the entire church, I ask you: Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your own sins?

We do.

Do you accept the freedom and power God gives you to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves?

We do.

Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to all peoples?

We do.

Will you nurture Kinsley in Christ's holy church, that by your teaching and example she may be guided to accept God's grace for herself, to profess her faith openly, and to lead a Christian life?

We will.

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Do you, as Christ's body, the church, reaffirm both your rejection of sin and your commitment to Christ?

We do.

As Christ's body, the church, let us reaffirm our belief and commitment to the faith as it is taught us in the Scriptures and the Old and New Testaments.

Do you believe in God the Father?

Yes, we believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

Yes, we believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, was born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and shall return to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

Yes, we believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Will you nurture one another in the Christian faith and life and include Kinsley now before you in your care?

The congregation responds:

With God's help we will proclaim the good news and live according to the example of Christ. We will surround Kinsley Elizabeth with a community of love and forgiveness that she may grow in her trust of God, and be found faithful in her service to others. We will pray for her, that she may be a true disciple who walks in the way that leads to life.

The pastor now prays the following prayer:

Heavenly Father, pour out your Holy Spirit on all those gathered here, but especially upon Kinsley, who now receives baptism. May her sins be washed away, her life be clothed in righteousness, that dying and being raised with Christ she may share in Christ's final victory. Amen.

The pastor addresses the family of the Baptism candidate:

What name is given this child?

Kinsley Elizabeth Howard,

I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

May the Holy Spirit work within you, that being born through water and the Spirit, you may be a faithful disciple of Jesus Christ.

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Let us pray. God, our heavenly Father, grant that this child, as she grows in years, may also grow in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ, and that by the restraining and renewing influence of the Holy Spirit, may ever be a true child of yours, serving you faithfully all her days. Guide and uphold Frank and Megan that by loving care, wise counsel, and holy example, they may lead Kinsley into that life of faith whose strength is righteousness and whose fruit is everlasting joy and peace through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Now it is our joy to welcome our newest sister in Christ.

Through baptism you are incorporated by the Holy Spirit into God's mighty acts of salvation throughout your life. With joy and thanksgiving we welcome you as a member of the family of Christ.
