We trust that your Christmas celebration was not only a pleasant experience with family and friends but was also filled with the presence of GOD's grace as we have remembered CHRIST's birth into this world for our sakes. May the LORD bless the new year 2014 with HIS great purpose for each one of us and HIS plan at Trinity Church. In last week's message we gave attention to the verses found in Luke's gospel that tell us Mary was attentive to the words of GOD spoken through an angel to her, angels to shepherds, prophets to her and through her relative Elizabeth the mother of John the Baptist. Now how was Mary attentive? It was not just that she heard and listened but that she pondered those words about Christ spoken to her through the counsel of both human beings and celestial beings. When one ponders a situation it implies they deeply and thoroughly consider the issue that presents itself to them. Mary teaches us a lesson often missed and when it is unheeded in our lives and others we tend to suffer the consequences for our neglect of pondering the situation and counsel of those who advise us and know better than we. There were many things that Mary pondered in her heart regarding what she was told considering the CHRIST child and HIS purpose in this world. We don't know them all. Some of what she pondered on is only implied in how the gospel narratives unfold before us as we read and study the scriptures. We covered a few that can be detected in between the lines. One is very important to us at Christmas. Christmas does not have to end after December 25th. Too often, we treat Christmas like an event rather than a continued celebration of the living CHRIST living and active in our midst all the year through. Mary did not stop pondering the purpose of CHRIST immediately after HIS birth. Why should we then make that mistake? A second principle to ponder has always had the potential to make many a human being fail to see the purpose of CHRIST's presence in this world. The incarnation both reveals the very worse and very best in the human race. It brings the joy and hope that we can be redeemed from the curse of sin and darkness we all suffer from. But it also brings the shock and pain of seeing what happens when human beings love darkness more than light and refuse to come into the light of JESUS CHRIST! The incarnation makes us scream, "oh how terrible the world is" and makes us shout, "Oh how wonderful is our great GOD and HIS Son, our salvation, the LORD JESUS!" Some persons get stuck in this area and only emphasize one of the two in such a way that brings no balance and misses the greater ramifications of GOD with us, Emmanuel. Another way to say all this is to put it this way. The incarnation does not take away the human beings free will. It both joyfully and painfully reminds us the human being has a free will and will practice it in response to the Christmas message. Then a third thing to ponder about Christmas that needs much pondering is this. Throughout history from before the formation of the scripture up into our present age the following principle is most unfortunately true. The greater the work of GOD is in its entrance into the world and the purpose of that work the more so too many persons just simply miss the point of the work of GOD or its arrival in our midst. The messiah was born in a stable to poor Jewish peasants because GOD saw to it that it happened that way. But why? Partly because GOD just works that way in our midst. The more GOD knows His work would not be received well or honored the more GOD hides it from the lives of those too busy to bother with GOD stuff. After all, can't GOD see how busy we are, how important we are, how much stuff we are already doing even for HIS sake and then occasionally someone will come along and claim something about GOD doing something new and different..... How do we respond to these stories and claims when we hear them? Are we like the shepherds, the wise men or like Herod and his court and the religious experts? Beloved may GOD grant you His grace to have humility in your heart to ponder the gifts of Christmas and take them with you throughout the year!!! Blessings for the journey!!!!
