Therefore, how does this influence our prayer life? Do we ever learn to pray for issues and tasks that so surpass our abilities that GOD alone would have to accomplish it for it to happen? Those type barriers can only be accomplished by a NOW BEYOND ABLE GOD! As wonderful as these truths are then our Heavenly Father would let us know "I'm at work within you"! Yes, I am a NOW BEYOND ABLE GOD but that power is at WORK in us! Wow! Thank you JESUS! Then to top it off our NOW BEYOND ABLE GOD who WORKS in us INVITES us to become more and more part of HIS wondrous plans in this generation of the history of the living Church we are invited to participate and live in. Well, I'm stirred as to whatever the LORD is up to! He has invited us all! Let's walk after JESUS and see what happens next. Blessings for the journey beloved, we are HIS and HE is ours to behold and serve into this new year!!!


