Did you watch the Super Bowl this past Sunday night? If you did and you are not a big time football fan, you probably wondered if some other team than Denver should have been in the Super Bowl based upon Denver's performance. It was a disappointment if you tuned in expecting a competitive game won in the last minutes by one of the two teams. We'll discuss the application of this game to our life today and being on the LORD's super life team we are all invited to participate in.

In last week's message the purpose of the theme, Being on the LORD's Super Life Team, was introduced. We celebrated the LORD's Supper, and the exhortation was made to draw a parallel between what we know and bring to the LORD's Supper compared to what we know and bring to our love of football, and then how this effects the way we live our life every day. That was a lot to do in 20 minutes. We barely scratched the surface of this material.

But here are some principles to consider along the way. The super bowl was watched by over 110 million people in the United States. The only thing that is participated in worldwide more than that is Christian Worship. Persons watch the super bowl for many reasons and they participate in Christian activities for many reasons too. What are our motivations? Do we approach the LORD's Table with an attitude that GOD can work in us or not? For the casual football fan, a game is to be entertaining and enjoyed but not be so important as to influence our reflections about the rest of life. This is healthy and should be the case in our reflections about sports, but this should not be true when it comes to the believer's approach and outlook to the LORD's Supper. The communion service should be a time of celebration and encounter with the living GOD we serve!!! What is our purpose when we take the LORD's Supper? The answer will be reflected in the results obtained from the experience of GOD we receive or not in the LORD's Supper.

There were Bronco fans Sunday night devastated by their teams loss while Seahawk fans literally danced in their dens and even on the streets! For what reason? We know the answer but how important was last week's game compared to the reality of life? GOD is searching the world for hearts and minds that have lived long enough to know that there is nothing more satisfying than knowing and serving the living GOD as demonstrated in JESUS CHRIST!

What would happen if a football team had every team member give their absolute best on the playing field in one game? We got an example of that last Sunday night! Well then, what would happen if a local church had every team member give their absolute best in service to Christ and HIS church and the community around them? The world has not seen that local church yet. As the Seahawk QB Russell Wilson stated, "why not us" so should every believer and every local church ask the same question, "why not us, LORD"? What can we do to most effectively serve you JESUS? And GOD would say, "why not you!" I'll be glad to take you further into my purpose and plan if you only really want it!
