Sermon Review & Introduction

This enhances the wonder and effectiveness of every single worship service. When an open hearted, teachable, currently committed disciple of JESUS CHRIST objectively evaluates their ministry in their local church and concludes it needs GOD's immediate further transforming grace, then two issues are certain. One, this is possible and two, it means your worship and ministry priorities have somewhat become disconnected to the greater purposes of the LORD! What does this have to do with being on the first string GOD's team? ALOT!!! When we create unseen or seen class systems in a local church, we are only dooming our future! Furthermore, we are placing emphasis on who we think is most important or not. If CHRIST is not the most important central figure and focus in our midst, then we must change priorities lest we sabotage our potential. Another truth in all these statements is this; if it's ineffective, boring and over predictable it's not the fault of FATHER GOD almighty. GOD never has been a failure in anything.
