Sermon Review & Introduction

This wasn't referred to in the message last week but English Pearcy and I have something in common. We both pastored the Adnah UMC in Islandton SC!!! Had I known English 25 years ago he would have been invited down to Adnah to speak, but sometimes we just cannot get all of GOD's blessings!!! So, last week when I referred to Mrs. Bessie Lee Bishop, English told me later, "I can see her telling you what she said Robert." And what did she say? About 3 to 5 months into my tenure at Adnah, Bessie Lee walked out of a worship service one day and said to me, "Pastor, every sermon just keeps getting better than the NEXT". She walked off and then it hit me what the implication was of her statement. Although some critics may think she meant what she said I believe she meant to say "LAST" at the end of her statement. At least I pray that is what she meant! But here's a very sad realization. How sad it is when some persons cannot see that every service can be and should be better than the last worship experience we participated in. Now, I'm not saying every message is better, every song is better, every volunteer shares better and every praver is better and better. What I'm referring to in it getting better and better is where do we place our focus in worship? If the focus is us and what we are going through and what we think and want, then those attitudes are guaranteed to ruin any worship service. And why is that? Because worship is not about us or what we think and want. Worship is about JESUS! The more we can focus on the central figure of human history the better that worship service becomes! This may sound impossible, but when our hearts and attitudes are turned the right way, the power of HIS grace and majesty makes all things new in our life and focus. The main thing we can learn regarding this subject matter is this. What a shame it is to waste our worship time focusing on ourselves instead of focusing on JESUS!!! What an opportunity it is to receive with gladness the new possibilities CHRIST has in every situation if we will take HIS directions seriously. Words like worship, JESUS and grace should never, never, never be the synonyms of words like boring, predictable, irrelevant, lifeless, etc. LORD of life, JESUS come and renew us now!!! Amen!!!
