Sermon Review

How many of you are afraid of water? Many persons are who cannot swim. Some persons are afraid of being on a boat miles from the shore. I'm somewhat like that myself, especially if the boat is smaller. But here is something that none of us can really imagine being in the middle of, being challenged by or being faced with. Look at Noah and his family floating on a world-wide flood. What few of us understand is the reality that in the pre-flood world Noah lived in they did not experience rain, much less any flooding! Never had Noah been in a place where there was no land within sight anywhere! As I stated last Sunday, this was probably the greater challenge in Noah's journey. Have you ever been in a predicament so different and challenging that you could actually say "Well, no one before has experienced this" or "Never before have I seen this type of situation". While our faith may be often challenged, very few of us could ever claim that our situation is a unique first time ever in human history difficulty that we face. But Noah could have stated that and not have exaggerated one moment the severity of his trial and faith. That said, if GOD was faithful and true to Noah in that first time ever situation then of course GOD will be faithful to us as well in our trials and tribulations even though they have presented themselves to other human beings in the past. In a word, please see the Noah movie if possible. It can be of some value to your faith journey although the movie is not perfect in its portrayal of Noah or the Biblical account of Noah's story.

Several of you have asked me about the trip to India and how did it go. Thank you for your interest. I will address the trip today, I trust, in a fashion that connects the experience to Biblical principles we all are called to and can walk in, even if we don't take international trips on any regular basis. I thank GOD for that opportunity and the benefit of it to my faith journey.
