Sermon Review

What a very special time is today in our worship service as we welcome our very own Laurie Knapp who will be sharing the Word of GOD with us!!! Thank you to Laurie for what she has to share with us as the LORD has been ministering HIS Word to her and now we get to benefit from it!

If you were here last week I shared with you about my trip to India. The experience there was a blessing to my faith journey and yet another learning lesson in seeing all the wondrous grace acts our LORD is doing around the world. As much as we should thank GOD for what our LORD is doing in our midst in North America let us not forget that GOD is moving all around the world! Only the LORD knows who might be our neighbor in HIS perfect splendor of heaven. It might be someone from India, China or Scotland and from a different time era. Anyhow, maybe you have never thought about anything like that but I do.

Of course, last Monday we had the opportunity to remember and thank our GOD for those who have served our country in the military and for the many who ultimately gave their lives in service to the country. Did you see the paper last Monday morning? There are currently 114 persons from South Carolina alone who have perished in Afghanistan since the American military presence has been in operation. Even today, our world is not totally safe and it would be even more unsafe if not for our military's presence and work to keep evil forces from doing whatever they please to terrorize human beings. Thank you American military forces for what you are doing to keep America safe!

Well, what does this have to do with Christian ministry and mission work? Are the two related? They are and I drew a parallel between the two forces of Christian mission work and military presence ultimately working together for the benefit of the world. When a nation is impacted by the gospel of the Kingdom of JESUS CHRIST this has the long term influence of conditioning a nation to treat its citizens in reasonable, merciful and judicious ways that correlates with Judeo-Christian values which do not violate basic human rights. So, when nations either have a Judeo/Christian value system in their beginnings (America) or are influenced by Christian mission work, the greater the probability that such nations do not become national and international threats to the sanctity of human life. If Christian mission and evangelism work does stop the root of evil in human hearts and minds then the chances are decreased that military intervention will have to stop the fruit of evil from destroying nations. Another way to say this that could be easier to remember is to use this catch phrase. If the church house can run the devil out of a country through ministry then the White House will not have to shoot the devil out of a country through military force! This isn't said to imply that the military always uses force to do their job. They only do that when necessary to deal with forces contrary to peace and harmony for all people groups.

The church should do all they can to carry out the Great Commission of JESUS. But sometimes our voice is not heard and this is where the military is our friend. Another way to consider this is the following. Listen to the church about truth or listen to the police officer when they enforce the law. Although all military personnel are not believers and do not necessarily have a Biblical world view, still they carry out a great task that helps the Church carry out their task to let everyone know GOD loves them and CHRIST longs to redeem them from sin. Blessings for the journey!!!
