In the last two weeks we have looked at the subject matter of how important the concept is to our GOD regarding weddings. Jesus liked weddings for many reasons. One of his thoughts at every wedding he ever attended was "my turn is coming one day!"

Of course, for some of us this is a challenging notion for several reasons. One, many of us didn't know that weddings necessarily meant that much to JESUS. We might have thoughts like "well, JESUS cannot get married. So what is that important about weddings to him?". This is a very good question. It is correct that JESUS will not get married in the sense that human beings get married. JESUS is not going to pick out one woman over the hundreds of millions HE has known throughout history and marry that blessed female in eternity. No, JESUS is going to take a bride, the church, consisting of the entire lot of believers throughout history and will walk in a relationship with that bride that is beyond our definition of relationship and marriage. In Ephesians, Paul calls this a mystery. It is a union that supersedes anything of comparison on earth.

Another issue some persons have with the wedding, bride and marriage analogy is this. They cannot get past the sexual connotations of such words. This is understandable. We are not suggesting that human sexuality has anything to do with this heavenly concept of wedding bliss between CHRIST and His church. Although I want to make it perfectly clear there is absolutely nothing wrong with human sexuality expressed in GOD's way in the confines of fidelity in marriage between men and women. The greatest intelligence and the greatest faith in the world cannot fully comprehend and explain what awaits the believers in eternity.

A third issue for some persons with the marriage, bride and wedding analogy from scripture has to do with the failure of the state of marriages in our society. Today, more than half of marriages end up in divorce. Many persons have been deeply devastated by broken marriages including the children that go through divorce along with their parents. So, for some persons marriage has not been pleasant and any emphasis on wedding and marriage bliss in heaven sounds too good to believe. The great news for the church is this. No matter what has happened in our world regarding the marriage relationship those mishaps will not exist in heaven.

One thing that GOD greatly desires to do for HIS church is to breathe HIS hope into us about this life and the next life both. We are in preparation for the next world. It could be said that this life is the rehearsal dinner for the next life. As this hope rises in us then it creates within us the ability and the desire to make this world a better place while we are here. We will begin looking into that initiative today.
