

Therefore every worship service where this happens is incredible and a wonderful memory in the days to come as we consider what the LORD has done for us and how wonderful are His continued plans in our midst. That said, there are some worship experiences where the LORD's grace is so tangible we know with certainty that we have been with JESUS. His presence is so real that nothing less than all His measure of love and mercy and plan is all we want and the only substance that can fill our hearts with sustaining grace for days ahead.

Such was our worship experience last week. If you were here, you should know what I'm referring to. If you were not here, don't conclude you totally missed it! What made last week so incredible is that we heard three testimonies from three persons who in one way or the other reached an impasse in their journey. Without the help of our Heavenly Father, they could not go further without being uncertain, wounded and bogged down by a heavy burden that would hinder much of their continued journey. One person's family lost everything. No income, no home, no money for college and no way to continue their college experience. What happened to them? The LORD came through as they looked to Him! Another person lost their spouse with little notice. A family lost their husband and father in less than three months after the diagnosis of cancer in the liver. What did they do? How did they go on? They lived on because of the presence of CHRIST living within them! That is bad enough. But there are those who taste hell's fury and evil more so than few of us ever will imagine. Our third witness has traveled that road. They lost their spouse and children to a shooting death and suicide. Those stories are so terrible we don't even want to think about them! That is understandable and sometimes reflects our mercy and love for the victims of such. But our guest had to feel that, live through that and deal with it somehow. They found JESUS was greater than their terrible tragedy. This was evident as they shared with us last week.

No matter what happens to any of us, no matter where we are and what we face, we have two options. We can face it with JESUS or without JESUS. Please take the first option. Personally, I have no idea as to how people make it through this world without JESUS. There is nothing He cannot do, cannot bear, cannot heal, cannot love, cannot forgive, cannot touch, cannot see, cannot understand, cannot overwhelm with His mercy and presence! So, let's continue to give ourselves away to JESUS always.

Today, we have the blessing and privilege to hear our new district superintendent, the Reverend Cathy Jamison-Ogg deliver the Word of GOD to us. I already know what some of you are possibly thinking. She knew nothing about what I have been preaching on nor did I know what she would speak about. That is the confirming work of HOLY SPIRIT. Two witnesses or more will confirm the message of the FATHER where ever the KINGDOM is at work. So, let's see what the LORD wants to tell us through our Superintendent today.
