Have you ever been allowed to listen in on a conversation and in the process realized for many reasons maybe you should not have had that privilege? Maybe the conversation was very private or personal or difficult for one or both parties. Maybe you could not deal with what was being said. It went against your convictions or your abilities to handle controversial material. Maybe you felt uncomfortable with the emotions of the conversation. They were highly charged. Maybe the persons were having an argument or disagreement and that type of conversation leaves you looking for a way out. Some persons cannot manage disagreements, arguments or other very challenging conversations that reveal one or both sides need to see something much better than they currently see the issue. Have you ever asked yourself if JESUS ever had a heated or difficult conversation with anyone? At first response, some of us would say, "of course, he didn't!" Oh really? Please examine some of the texts in the gospels again and you will see JESUS in some most uncomfortable conversations sometimes. Why? Primarily, because many persons wanted JESUS to say to them what they wanted to hear, not what they needed to hear. And when JESUS encountered these situations He did not back down to be nice, polite, docile, loving, kind or whatever that we might think JESUS would do to keep the peace at any cost. No, JESUS told the truth. However, He told the truth in a level of absolute love that left people dumbfounded that wanted to disagree and argue with him. What secret asset did JESUS possess? It's been mentioned already. He operated out of a level of love that no one had ever witnessed before. GOD is love! The scripture tells us so. However, defining love is a challenge for some disciples because their definition of love is mixed with interpretations of the word influenced by sin and incompletion and a lower level of knowledge about the entire world and life and truth and love. GOD doesn't have those problems when GOD defines love. We do. So, we not only must learn to walk in love. We must also learn and experience what is love. JESUS discussed it with Nicodemus. Nicodemus left thinking to himself, "I didn't understand everything JESUS said but I know He meant it and He loved me enough to point me in the right direction." Do we love that way? Or do we just want our way? Or do we just want to keep the peace and keep everyone happy? That's a myth! It's impossible to do. But it is possible to love persons where they are at in the hopes they get to where they need to be. Blessings for the journey!!!! Pastor Robert
