I trust that if you are not in the habit of gift giving during Christmas it is not for one of the two common reasons that persons give up on this idea. First, some of us understandably grow weary of the "rat race" and tyranny of gift giving that creates stress, anxiety and something else that must be done before December 25th. When we get tired of gift giving traditions, then we possibly need the LORD's grace to drink from to fill our thirsty souls with something with more sustenance than what parties and gifts do for us. It's not so much that we don't want to give, but we are tired of giving when the purpose and genuine celebration of Christmas gets lost in what becomes a meaningless mess. Secondly, some of us unfortunately and understandably cease gift giving because everyone we use to give to has died, grown up, left our life or whatever. How sad it is this happens. Although relationships change and persons do leave our life the need for giving never ceases. We can focus on this in either a positive or negative way. It's our choice. Can you give to others that need it? There are children who have no grandparent models in their life. They could use our time, attention and a few gifts. What about elderly persons left with no one to give them anything they might actually need? There are persons in nursing homes who have need. Could we not help them? When I hear a person say, "I have no one to give anything to", while it may appear justifiable to them there are always persons who need our help. So if we quit giving to anyone why is this the case? Is Christmas giving not about reflecting the joy and wonder of the greatest gift ever given, JESUS CHRIST the LORD of all life and glory and eternity? As JESUS keeps giving himself to us may we keep that gift in mind and in turn practice the same.
