

Sermon Introduction and Review

When I was younger I could easily tell you who played in the Super Bowl, the score and numerous other things about each of those games as if it still really mattered today. Now I'm older, and past about Super Bowl 30 I get the games mixed up and don't remember some of them and to top that off I cannot even tell you the Roman numerals that have always been used. Next year is Super Bowl 50! In the Roman numerals this should be "Super Bowl L" but somehow that just doesn't have the pizzazz some of the other Super Bowls have had. I mean who would even want to watch "Super Bowl L"? If one doesn't know the history of the Roman numerals being used in the game they will be left wondering why the game is referred to with the letter L. What does that mean? Super Bowl Lottery? Super Bowl Lightening? Super Bowl Lovers? You may not agree but the N.F.L. offices were concerned and for the first time ever the Super Bowl will be called "Super Bowl 50"!!! Wow!!! They've changed the name this coming year!

There's a bigger game than the Super Bowl. It is called life and sometimes life must change in ways we are not ready for, but without planning for change we may not win the big game of life. When we refuse to change we are refusing to stay healthy and live! Often in our life journey our resistance to change is nullified by the force of events and circumstances we cannot resist. Somehow the local church is one of the most preserved, protected and pampered places in the world that does defend itself from the necessity of change. And what happens when this takes place? What I've already referred to. Too often, we become sick and suffer in the local church since we've identified change as an enemy to our purpose. But what about the purpose of JESUS? JESUS, our great coach through the playbook of discipleship, knows the game plan will often change as necessary for us to win the big game of life. It is not so much that JESUS has to change everything no matter what. It is more so that everything changes when JESUS is calling the plays because JESUS is so different than what we become accustomed to. Remember this the next time you hear HOLY SPIRIT calling you to come closer to JESUS in "picking up your cross" & following HIM.

Yesterday was Valentine's Day. If you are married and here then you probably remembered to give your spouse some form of love and greeting to let them know how special they are. The reason I say it that way is that if you forgot you would not be here. You would be in the doghouse or the hospital and you would never forget to give that special person a Valentine's Day gift! We do forget things and sometimes it is very embarrassing. One evening, I took a new friend and their spouse to dinner. I spilled water all over myself and eventually realized I had no money with me! I'm sure the couple was impressed! Melanie was not! We should be so glad and so THANKFUL our Heavenly Father never forgot us at anytime! This is even more true when we have been in great distress. CHRIST has loved us no matter what & calls us further into relationship with His grace no matter how resistant we sometimes have been. Did your heart receive the comfort of the LORD's grace this week when HE in a variety of ways told you, "I love you"?
