As we often do on the first Sunday of each month, we celebrated the LORD's Supper last week. If you were not able to be with us this past Sunday, we will have a Maundy Thursday Service on April 2nd to remember, commemorate and celebrate our LORD JESUS' victory over satan, death, and sin and our enslavement to those forces. There are many mysteries to the sacrament of HOLY COMMUNION. This holy meal has the power to bring to our lives healing and intimacy with CHRIST. Or this holy meal, when taken with no willingness to discern the intent of GOD's continued purpose within it, can lead to trials and setbacks beyond our comprehension. Some persons cannot accept this reality. They wish to believe that one can partake of communion without any regard to GOD's work in it and receive the blessing of it without question. If this were true we should consider the case of Judas. He sat with our LORD in the Passover, and shared in the very meal our LORD fulfilled some of the prophetic messages of the meal, but yet he betrayed JESUS and eventually hung himself in disgrace and the LORD himself spoke of his destruction. The communion sacrament is not a magic potion to be taken that makes everything wonderful no matter what, how or when we respond to JESUS' grace. Paul warned the believers in Corinth to give consideration to their lifestyle keeping in mind their participation in the LORD's Supper. Their conduct should reflect the life of JESUS since they are identifying themselves with CHRIST through the LORD's Supper. In summary the Holy Communion sacrament is a meal that heals the repentant disciple or is a meal that releases judgment upon undiscerning, unrepentant and undisciplined persons who take its power for granted or worse yet believe it is nothing more than a magic potion to GOD's acceptance no matter what they do.

When we think about body health, even the least informed person understands basic truths about one's health. We know if we overeat, don't exercise and abuse our health then we will suffer in our health. It is so unfortunate many persons cannot see the same truth applies when we consider the body of CHRIST and how its health is a reflection of our lifestyles and attitudes. Many of the principles that are applicable to our physical health are also true of our spiritual health and the state of the local church where CHRIST's body resides. May the LORD grant us, His body, wisdom about these truths.
