I want to do my part to encourage everyone to be here next week to celebrate the presence of CHRIST and to celebrate together the cantata Christopher and our Choir will be presenting. They have planned long and you'll be blessed to hear this offering of praise to our LORD. As we say in texting, "C U nxt week".

Today's message is a continuance of last week's emphasis, "What JESUS Knew About Everything We Often Don't See". In the first message, the primary thought was that our Heavenly Father is ultimately in control. JESUS knew this. Most of us claim we know it but we don't live like we know it. We are motivated by our feelings, our situations, our desires and our limited cognitive intelligence in how we analyze and process events. In short, if we don't like it, we want something different yesterday.

We must ask ourselves where our trust in GOD is in all this. Are we trusting the LORD because HE is in control, or are we trusting HIM to do what we want because the truth is we are still attempting to control life and everything else around us? Think about it this way. There is no way JESUS would have ever approached the cross if He did not absolutely know the LORD was in control. It is possible one day in heaven the LORD JESUS will talk about all the times he looked around himself in his earthly life and saw nothing but the limited mindset of everyone struggling for position in their culture. Maybe JESUS didn't think that when he saw the widow put her money in the offering or when the centurion told JESUS to just speak the WORD and his child would be healed. There are a few other examples when someone actually trusted GOD. It's not that we don't trust GOD at all, but until we more deeply trust HIM with our all, then all HE is cannot influence and bless our life situation. It's not that we don't trust GOD at all, but until our all in our limited knowledge is laid down on the altar, all HIS plan cannot be released in our lives.

Yes, JESUS knew things most believers don't always use to filter life through, and thus we suffer the consequences of fear, unbelief, defeat, worry, selfishness and a limited experience of the fullness of GOD's activity in our life. When we see the LORD's best it isn't because everything is just our way, it's because we are learning to trust the LORD no matter what is happening in us, around us, to us, for us or against us because JESUS is for us more than anything else is! Enjoy life more! Trust JESUS like never before! AMEN!!! Blessings for the journey! Pastor Robert
