In Today's Message, we address an exhortation from the scriptures that touches everyone's need to heed the greatest advice anyone could give anyone, and that is to "Do whatever He tells you". Of course, we are referring to doing whatever the LORD JESUS would direct us to do with any given situation. While this message is directed first to exhort our students and nine graduates that we recognize and honor this morning, the message is applicable to all of us.

In last week’s message, I delivered the first of three to four messages to enlighten our thinking and living about the resurrection. Sooner or later in our life journey we will experience such great hardship of unfair, unjust and unmerciful difficulties that we could call them "Judas factors". They may not involve the intention of betrayal but they create just as much confusion and pain as any intended betrayal could cause.

How does anyone handle such situations lest those hardships bruise our lives with destructive force? While there are those who will grunt it out and still be breathing but damaged, wounded and now less whole than they were, others will give up and die within or they will discover resurrection. What type of resurrection can we discover? We are talking about the power of JESUS CHRIST to not only heal us, but to give us newness of life that whatever happened and wherever we were, JESUS heals us and then breathes a new life into us that places us into a better place than we were before our sorrow and hardship. 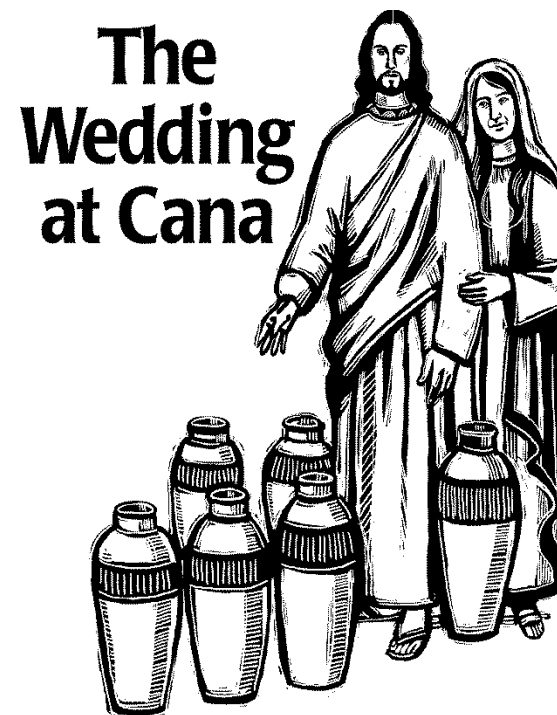
