

As of today's Worship service, we are down to our last four Sundays at Trinity. Arguably, last week's message and this one might be the most important sermons I've brought to your pulpit in the two years we've been here. The main primary core message last week was this. We can only carry our local church into the future so far without the further energizing powerful impact of the HOLY SPIRIT bringing fresh encounters of grace and new baptisms of cleansing freeing grace. Without knowing it, many local churches treat their church as if it never needed the refueling power of HOLY SPIRIT ministry. None of us would ever purchase a new vehicle with a fresh tank of gasoline and then presume we would never have to refill the tank. Of course we would not do that. But oh how sad it is that some of us do exactly that when it comes to our local church! Once we get started we act as if there's never a need to stop and refuel with open hearts turning to GOD and saying to our LORD, "fill us again LORD, with your SPIRIT for your purpose in our midst". I've heard the majority of the excuses. Most of them deal with our presuppositions about what Methodists presume we believe about the HOLY SPIRIT. Ultimately, some United Methodists believe we really don't believe or allow room for any expressions of HOLY SPIRIT empowerment in our church. THAT IS NOT THE CASE! If it were the truth, it would be the equivalent of the medical doctor claiming they didn't believe that blood loss was dangerous to one's health! Another popular excuse to resist the HOLY SPIRIT's ministry in our local churches is our preoccupation with our "tradition". Anytime, any local church would rather keep everything going the same way instead of allowing the HOLY SPIRIT to come to our place and bring fresh grace and new ability to know and serve our mighty GOD then we have a problem bigger than anyone can address in a brief article like this. My prayer for all of us is that we always allow the HOLY SPIRIT to completely have HIS way for CHRIST's purpose and sake in our midst. Any local church without HOLY SPIRIT ministry is like a hospital without medicine, blood reserves or electricity. Such hospitals would never help ill or injured persons to recover. We know that. Local churches without continued HOLY SPIRIT grace cannot set the captive free. Unfortunately, we keep doing church business as if we do not know what should be obvious.

In today's message, we ask the question, "can you hear the 10 virgins talking now?" Jesus told a story that one key truth to the parable often goes unseen. Who's doing the most talking in most local churches? The bridesmaids from their perspective or the friend of the bridegroom who speaks the counsel of the LIVING GOD? Blessings for the journey!!!
