Matthew Skipper volunteers with Catholic Charities and is asking his church to help with collecting men's clothing for their ongoing ministry. Boxes have been placed on the stage in the Fellowship Hall. Let's do all we can, remembering "we are blessed to be a blessing". Read about it below in Matthew's words:

Catholic Charities of the Midlands has two main ministries - <u>Clean of Heart</u> and the <u>Clothing Closet</u>. Clean of Heart provides laundry and shower services to Columbia's downtown homeless population. Clean of Heart opened its doors in March of 2011. Since opening, 8800 loads of laundry have been washed for 800 unduplicated clients. Volunteers have logged 7000 hours of service.

In partnership with Clean of Heart, Catholic Charities of the Midlands operates a Clothing Closet ministry which provides new and used clothing items and shoes to Columbia's homeless population. The Clothing Closet Ministry began in 2000 and assists approximately 100-125 clients per month.

CLEAN of HEART is open MWF 8:30-12:30 and TTH 1:00-4:00. We use three volunteers MWF and two volunteers TTH. Most of the volunteers commit to one day per month, but we have a few who come weekly or biweekly. The volunteers operate the washers and dryers, help fold clothing, clean/disinfect the showers after each use, and the best part, if you ask me, converse with the clients. :) Our youngest volunteer has been 11 years old and our oldest is 87!! I am happy to speak to anyone who may have an interest in volunteering. Many people like to come visit to get a tour and see the ministry in action before committing. I am happy to schedule a time with anyone!
