

Participation: Participants must complete and return the food co-op application with payment to the RSVP Program. The coop is open to individuals 50 and older and is available to anyone in the community.

**Payment:** Payment must be paid in advance (unless other arrangements have been made with RSVP staff). Payment may be made with cash, check or money order. DO NOT SEND CASH IN THE MAIL. CHECKS MUST BE MADE OUT TO RSVP.

Ways to Help: You can volunteer to help pack produce, to help deliver bags to shut-ins, or to help at Trinity when people are picking up produce.

Becky Derrick works with RSVP and will be coordinating the co-op.
