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Jesus has been on tour. He has gone on a circuit of the villages of Galilee and across to the Decapolis, gentile territory. He has taught and preached and gathered disciples. He has cast out demons, healed the sick, stilled a storm. Then he returns to his hometown of Nazareth.

There he is greeted with disbelief; therefore he is unable to do any deed of power. He cannot perform any of the miracles he has done up to this point except to heal a few sick people.

He leaves Nazareth and goes about the other villages in Galilee. He calls the twelve, gives them authority over unclean spirits, and instructions. Then he sends them out as extensions of his ministry. The disciples go out and proclaim that all should repent. They cast out demons and cure the sick.

The disciples were sent out as extensions of Jesus' ministry to the world. They were sent to places Jesus, being human and therefore limited by time and space, could not go. They went out as extensions of Jesus' ministry to proclaim the Good News that God desires reconciliation, so all should turn to God and change their ways. They were extensions of Jesus' ministry to overcome the evil in the world. They were extensions of Jesus' ministry to heal and restore creation. They were extensions of all aspects of Jesus' ministry.

This is a precursor to the mission of the disciples after the death and resurrection of Jesus. They were to be extensions of Jesus' ministries of reconciling people to God, overcoming evil in the world, and healing to restore creation after Jesus was gone from them. Through them, Jesus' ministry on Earth would continue throughout time.

Jesus' ministry continues throughout time as disciples are called to be extensions of his ministry. Now we may think that those who are called as extensions of Jesus' ministry are those who are special. To use the Methodist terminology, people who are ordained, commissioned, or licensed to be pastors, but that is not the case.

Jesus sent all twelve, including the one that would deny him and the one that would betray him. All of them deserted him in the Garden of Gethsemane. Doesn't seem that they were that special, but they were his disciples.

As disciples of Jesus, we are extensions of Jesus' ministry of reconciling people to God, overcoming evil, and healing to restore creation. We who claim Jesus as our Lord and Savior are extensions of Jesus' ministry in the world today. Every one of us sitting in these pews, participating online, and reading these words are extensions of Jesus' ministry in the world today. You are an extension of Jesus' ministry in the world today.

We are not just extensions of Jesus' ministry on Sunday Mornings. We are not just extensions of Jesus' ministry while we do church or philanthropic work. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry 24/7. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry in everything we do and say. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry in our church life. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry in our home life. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry in our workplace. We are extensions of Jesus' ministry as we shop at Food Lion, eat at our favorite restaurant, go to ball games, and everything else we do during the week. Sunday morning worship and other church activities are times when we may be refueled to be extensions of Jesus' ministry in the world.

Sadly, Christians often fail to be extensions of Jesus' ministry to the world. Mahatma Gandhi, the Indian liberator, was greatly influenced by the teaching of Jesus, particularly the *Sermon on the Mount*. He saw much in common with his Hindu faith and the Christian faith. However, he was very critical of Christians and the church. He was quoted as saying, "I like your Christ. I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ."

If we are truly disciples of Jesus and participate in Jesus' ministry in the world today, we must be careful that all we do re-presents Jesus and his ministry to the world. Does what we do or say keep people from wanting to be reconciled to God or do we draw people closer to God? Does what we do or say perpetuate evil or overcome evil? Does what we do or say exacerbate the woundedness and brokenness in the world, or do we bring healing and restoration?

As disciples of Jesus, we are extensions of his ministry in the world today. We are to utilize our gifts to bring people to be reconciled to God, to overcome evil in the world, and to heal and restore creation.

As we participate in the life, death, and resurrection through the sacrament of Holy Communion today, may we be refueled to be extensions of Jesus' ministry of reconciliation, healing, and restoration as we are reconciled, healed, and restored.
