# 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

Today we had the joy of baptizing Everly and Lyla Faye. I confess that baptisms are my favorite thing in ministry. Baptism is an outward sign of God's grace continually poured out upon us. God's grace has been poured out upon Everly and Lyla Faye, not through the water but through the Holy Spirit which has been with them since birth. From the time we are born, God's grace is poured out upon all of us.

This grace that surrounds us from birth is prevenient grace. Wesley defines prevenient grace as, "the first wish to please God, the first dawn of light concerning his will, and the first transient conviction of having sinned against him."1 Prevenient Grace makes us aware of our sins so that we may please God and do God's will. Once we become aware of our sin, which is the first step of repentance we discussed last week, we become remorseful and displeased with ourselves. We ask forgiveness and turn from our sin. God then pours upon us justifying grace which frees us from the guilt and power of sin and aligns our will to God's will. As our will becomes aligned with God's we join in Christ. What does it mean to be "in Christ?" It means we enter into the indwelling love of the Son for the Father. Then, our desire becomes to be completely obedient to the Father as the Son was. The love of Christ dwells in us and we dwell in the love of Christ. We are born again. We become a new creation, with the image of God stamped on our hearts. We become holy creatures with the whole mind which was in Christ Jesus2. As Paul says, "there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" This new creation began with the resurrection of Jesus which ushered in a new way of being. The old way of being was transformed into something new. The human point of view was transformed into God's point of view. The new creation began with the resurrection of Jesus and continues as the hearts and minds of humans are reconciled to God through Christ. As we repent of our sin, God by grace reconciles us and we are made new creatures. We are changed and transformed! As Wesley says,

"(We) have new life, new senses, new faculties, new affections,

new appetites, new ideas, and conceptions. (Our) whole tenor a new world. God, men, the whole creation, heaven, earth,

and

of action and conversation is new, and (we) live, as it were, in all therein appear in a new light and stand related to (us) in a

new manner since (we) were created anew in Christ Jesus.3

It is not that the world changes but that we are changed. God pours out sanctifying grace that continually changes us so we reflect the image of God in which we were created. Not only is our behavior changed, but also our attitudes, emotions, ways of thinking and perceiving, so we see all people and things in a new light. We no longer regard others from a human point of view but a divine point of view.

Paul made a perfect example as he says we once knew Christ from a human point of view but we no longer see him that way. From a human point of view, Jesus was a man from a backwater village in a backwater province whose ideas threatened the establishment and needed to be eliminated. However, as a new creation after his encounter with Christ on the road to Damascus, Paul sees Jesus as the Christ who died for all so all could live in him and be reconciled to God. We are put in the right relationship with God.

We are put in a right relationship with God by God's grace. By God's prevenient grace we seek God and become aware of our sin. We repent and God imbues us with justifying grace which takes away the guilt and power of sin over us even as we continue to live in a state of sin. As Charles Wesley says in his hymn Love Divine All Loves Excelling, "take away our bent to sinning." We are changed both immediately and gradually.

We are changed immediately in that our desires and perceptions are changed. We no longer see things in a human manner but through the eyes of Christ. We no longer desire the things of the world but desire a closer and deeper relationship with God.

As we are justified, we begin the process of sanctification. We are granted God's sanctifying grace, the grace that continues to open our eyes, minds, and hearts to the

workings of God. This grace reveals to us what God is saving us for and how we are to participate in restoring creation. Sanctifying grace taps into the energy that renews creation. We seek a more perfect future and it opens us to new possibilities for ourselves, for the church, and the world.

By grace, we become a new creation. Prevenient grace surrounds us from birth, so we recognize right from wrong. We become aware of our sin and repent. Justifying grace removes the guilt of sin and breaks the power of sin over us. Therefore, our will becomes aligned with God's will. We are reborn. Through sanctifying grace we begin the process of restoring the image of God within ourselves. We are drawn closer in love with God and neighbor as the image of God is restored in us and we reflect God's image to the world.

This may be a poor analogy but this process is like cleaning a dirty mirror. We become aware that the mirror is dirty. The image it reflects is distorted and blurry (prevenient grace). We get some Windex and paper towel. We spray the Windex on the mirror (justifying grace). Then we wipe the mirror with the paper towel. As we wipe the mirror the image in the mirror becomes clearer until it reflects the true image (sanctifying grace).

By grace, God takes the distorted image we present and makes us a new creation that truly reflects the image of God in us.
