Surrounded! 8/14/2022

Hebrews 11:29-12:2

We are surrounded! It seems that we are surrounded by evil on all sides. Look at what is going on in the world: war, mass shootings, school shootings, opioid addiction, human trafficking, racism, sexism, ageism, any other ism you can think of, divisions on top of divisions, church attendance declining and we could go on and on. We are surrounded!

Yes, we are surrounded. We are completely surrounded. We are surrounded by a cloud of witnesses, not evil. The writer of Hebrews begins chapter 11 by defining faith and the nature of faith. The writer continues by enumerating the heroes of faith beginning with Abel and continuing through Abraham, Moses, and those we read today. These persevered in their faith in God's promises, even though they did not see the fulfillment of the promise which came through Jesus.

We are surrounded by a thick cloud of witnesses. For many years, while Ashton and her cousins were growing up, my Mother rented a cabin in Franklin NC. We would stay for a week or however long we could; tubing, hiking, shopping, exploring, playing games, and just being together. One year Kay, Ashton, the nephews, their friend, and I decided to hike up the Appalachian trail from Tellico Gap to Tellico mountain. It was one of those drizzly days where the clouds hung low. We reach the top of the mountain and climbed the observation tower, which was some 40-50 feet tall and about 25-30 feet square. The cloud that surrounded us was so thick, that we could not see the ground. We could barely see across the observation platform. Our cloud of witnesses is that thick or thicker.

Our cloud of witnesses includes those Old Testament heroes enumerated by the writer of Hebrews. It includes the apostles and those that witnessed the life and work of Jesus firsthand. It includes all those who spread the gospel- Paul, Barnabus, Aquilla, Priscilla, and the nameless others- through the Roman world, Africa, and Asia. Our cloud of witnesses includes all the heroes of the Bible who persevered in faith.

Our cloud of witnesses includes the early church fathers- Athanasius, Irenaeus, and Augustine to name a few. These established the prime doctrines of the universal church.

Our cloud of witnesses includes those who established the monastic movement- Benedict, Bernard of Clairvaux, Theresa of Avila, and Francis of Assisi. These monasteries provided most of the scholarship of the medieval period. So the great medieval scholars- Anselm, Abailard, Lombard, Ockham, and others - are in our cloud of witnesses.

Our cloud of witnesses includes the reformers Luther, Calvin, and Wesley. It includes the great preachers and evangelists, Whitfield, Fosdick, and Graham to name a few. The great theologians of our time- Tillich, Bonhoeffer, Barth, and others are included. All these great heroes of faith from the beginning to the present are in our cloud of witnesses.

All these are in our cloud of witnesses. But others are in each of our individual cloud of witnesses. Those who have influenced us by their faith. This may be our parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles. Our cloud may include preachers, Sunday School teachers, and other church folks. There may be teachers, coaches, and mentors who were examples of faith to us. Our cloud of witnesses includes all the people in our lives who have in some way nurtured our faith.

Our cloud of witnesses is many-layered. Moving inside out may begin with those who have influenced our faith directly. Then move out to those who influenced them. We can continue throughout history exposing layer after layer of witnesses to the beginning of time.

Think about it. Everyone throughout the course of history who persevered in faith in God's promise has been a witness to our faith today. They are in this cloud that surrounds every one of us.

When we say the Apostle's Creed we are making the same affirmation of faith that Christians worldwide are making today and have made for the past two thousand years. Everyone who has said that Creed is a part of our cloud of witnesses.

That is a comfort - to know that our loved ones who have passed away remain with us in this cloud. I like to use this image at funerals. It is a comfort to know that our loved ones remain with us.

However, our cloud of witnesses is just not for our comfort. They are examples to us so that we may keep our eyes fixed upon Jesus as they kept their eyes fixed upon Jesus. They remained focused on Jesus despite hardship, persecution, ostracism, and even death. They had faith that they would receive God's promise of reconciliation and restoration.

Not only are they examples of faith, but they also encourage us in our faith. Kay and I have done a few races with Ashton and Charlie. (Note I said done, not run. We usually walk.) At points throughout the course, there are people who make sure you stay on the course and encourage you. You may be barely putting one foot in front of the other but they are yelling, "You are doing great!" When you hear that you pick up your pace a little bit.

You may ask, "How can people from the past encourage me now?"

My race to become an ordained elder has been long and fraught with obstacles from the beginning. After my first meeting with the District Committee of Ministry to become a certified candidate, I was told I would receive a letter with the committee's decision in about a week. About a week later I received a letter stating I was not certified as a candidate for ministry but could reapply later. No explanation was given just three sentences.

I was devastated! I began questioning my call. My mentor, Dickie Knight, was as surprised as I was. My mind went into some bad places. It was one of the darkest times in my life.

One day, in my despair, I went to a desk we have which was built by my great-great-uncle for my grandmother in 1927. On the desk was this Bible which belonged to my uncle who had just passed away. Uncle Alfred was a United Methodist Pastor in South Georgia for over 40 years. I do not know why I did this but I flipped open the Bible and my eyes fell on this verse. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses..."

I did not go any further for at that moment I felt Uncle Alfred with me. I also felt my father and brother, my grandparents, Kay's Dad, uncles, aunts, Sunday school teachers, and even Uncle Joe Bell, who made the desk, with me. All were saying, don't stop. This is a minor setback. Keep going, persevere.

Knowing I was surrounded by that cloud of witnesses, I could overcome the obstacles that confronted me through this process. With our cloud of witnesses, we all may persevere, knowing we are not alone.

It may seem we are surrounded by evil, but we are surrounded by a much thicker cloud of witnesses. With that cloud, we can overcome all evil we may face. We may run the race God has set before us with perseverance, with our eyes set upon Jesus. We may be strengthened and receive the promise God has for us.
