A Voice from the Cloud

Matthew 17: 1-9

#### **Transfiguration Sunday**

The clouds hung low over the mountain as we began our hike. The clouds hid the mountaintop. We thought the clouds would lift and our view unobstructed by the time we reached the mountaintop.

A light, misty rain began as we hiked up the mountain. Rather than lifting, the clouds became thicker and thicker. We could see no more than a few feet around us. Suddenly, we reached the top. We saw the steps of the observation tower that promised magnificent views. That was all we could see, just the steps leading into the cloud. We climbed the steps and onto the observation deck. Instead of magnificent views, the cloud was so thick we could barely see across the platform.

The cloud obliterated the promised views. We could barely see the tops of the trees below. This thick cloud completely enveloped us. In the nothingness of the cloud, we sensed a voice saying, "Wait for what I am about to reveal."

We waited. Gradually, the clouds lifted, revealing a glorious view of the valley below. The sky, which had been dull and grey, was now a bright blue. Various shades of green covered the mountainside and the valley below. We heeded the voice and were rewarded with the promised view. I believe the voice we sensed was the voice of God.

In today's passages from the Old Testament and Gospel, God appeared and spoke in a cloud. Throughout the Bible, the appearance and voice of God were often from a cloud. Moses received the Torah from a cloud. When the tabernacle was completed, God's presence entered in the form of a cloud. When the temple was completed, the same occurred. Ezekiel described the splendor of God as a cloud on a rainy day that spoke to him.

At Jesus' baptism, the heavens (clouds?) opened, and a voice from heaven spoke. Darkness (clouds?) covered the earth at the crucifixion. Jesus ascended in a cloud and will return in a cloud. The cloud motif links the Old and New Testaments.

In today's passage, Peter, James, and John saw Jesus with Moses and Elijah. When Peter offered to build three dwellings, a cloud overshadowed them.

The word translated as overshadowed is only used five times in the Bible. Three times are in the stories of the transfiguration, indicating being overshadowed by the presence of God.

The presence of God is often more acute in the nothingness which envelops us like a cloud. We felt God's presence in the nothingness surrounding us on the mountain we hiked. In nothingness, when we are emotionally, spiritually, mentally, and physically numb, God's presence is with us. All we can do in the cloud's nothingness is cry out to God and listen. Often in the nothingness, we hear, maybe not audibly, the voice of God.

We feel most alone in nothingness. We are afraid of nothingness. We cannot sense anything around us, like we could perceive nothing on the mountain. At that point, we recognize our need for God. We hear the voice of God in nothingness. We know that we are not alone and God is with us.

However, we are not distracted in the cloud. We can see nothing, so we are more acutely aware of our other senses. When we are not distracted by other sights or sounds, we may more easily hear God's voice and sense God's presence.

In Centering Prayer, one sits in silence for 20-30 minutes. It is difficult at first because one is easily distracted. As one continues this practice, it is easier to disregard distractions. To a degree, one places themselves in a cloud to sense God's presence.

The voice of God can be frightening. God spoke from the cloud, overcoming the disciples with fear. Encountering the divine is scary. Jesus told the disciples, "Get up and do not be afraid." The divine Son told them not to be afraid of God. The divine Son was with them, touching them and allaying their fear.

Likewise, Jesus is with us, allaying our fears as we encounter the divine. In this passage, there is an interesting little detail. God tells the disciples to listen to Jesus. The word, listen, is imperative, a command. Listening goes beyond hearing with the ears. God means for them to hear, heed, obey, and understand what Jesus teaches.

The first thing Jesus tells them is, "Get up and do not be afraid." Do not be afraid of God.

We are not to be afraid of God, in awe, yes; terrified, no. We are to hear, heed, obey, and understand the voice of God.

We find ourselves in clouds, in nothingness. At those times, we may be terrified, but Jesus says do not be afraid. Listen, you may hear the voice of God. Then heed God's voice, understand God's call, and obey. We can do so because, while the voice comes from the cloud, the presence of God is with us. God is with us in the cloud.

When we listen to the voice of God from the cloud, then understand, heed, and obey the voice what is to come will be revealed. For Peter, James, and John Christ's glory was revealed as they experienced the resurrected Jesus. For those of us who hiked up the mountain, a magnificent view was revealed. Whenever we hear, heed, understand, and obey God's voice from the cloud, what we are to do and be will be revealed.
