God's Family

John 14: 15-24

The bond between a mother and child is the greatest of all human bonds. This bond is unexplainable. I don't know when this bond begins: at conception, fetal heartbeat, first kick, or birth. The glue that holds this bond together is love. The love of a mother is the greatest of all human love.

Sadly, all people do not experience this bond. Some women, for whatever reason, are incapable of the love which creates this bond. They may have had a negative relationship with their mother. They may not have learned to love. Maybe their brains and psyche were just not wired to be a mother. Whatever the reason, we should not condemn the woman who chooses not to have a child.

Though we generally think of God the Father, plenty of Biblical references indicate a maternal aspect of God. One of these maternal images is of a mother hen protecting her brood. We see this image in Ruth 2: 12, Psalm 17: 8, 57:1. Also, in Matthew 23: 37 and Luke 13: 34, as Jesus laments over Jerusalem he says, "How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings." Isaiah 42: 14 reads, "Now I (God) will cry out like a woman in labor, I will gasp and pant." Isaiah 66: 13 God states, "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you; you shall be comforted in Jerusalem." Psalm 131 also gives the image of God as a mother comforting her child. Isaiah 49: 14 reads, "Zion said, the LORD has forsaken me," to which the LORD replies, "Can a woman forget her nursing child, or show no compassion for the child of her womb? Even these may forget, yet I will never forget you."

These passages remind us that we do have a Divine Mother. While our earthly mothers may be imperfect, broken, and possibly incapable of being a mother, we have a divine Mother who is perfect and never forgets us. God is the mother who will always protect, comfort, and never forget us.

In the farewell discourse to the disciples, Jesus says, "I will not leave you orphaned...." He tells the disciples that he is not going to go to heaven and forget them but will remain with them through the Paraclete. Paraclete may be defined as a helper, comforter, advocate, counselor, encourager, and exhorter. The correct definition of Paraclete is all of the above. It encompasses all of those words. When you look at those definitions, Paraclete sounds like a mother.

Father, Mother, and Son, these images run (directly or implicitly) throughout Jesus' farewell discourse. To me, this implies that the Trinity is a familial relationship. A family works together for the benefit of all members of the family. Likewise, the Trinity, God's family, works together for God's purposes. The essence of the divine family is self-giving love.

Since Jesus does not leave us orphaned, God draws us into the Divine Family. We are drawn into God's family because God's love abides in us. As Jesus is in the Father and we are in Jesus, then Jesus is in us. Admittedly, at first glance that may seem rather creepy, but the essence of Jesus is in us. Then the essence of God is in us. We are joined with Jesus and brought into God's family. We are pulled in by the centripetal force of God's love.

We demonstrate our participation in God's family by keeping the commandments Jesus gave. This commandment is to love. Jesus demonstrated divine love as he washed the feet of the disciples. We show Divine love in service to others and giving of ourselves to others. As we serve others in response to Jesus' command to love we are drawn into God's family.

Our human family may be broken and dysfunctional. Our human family may not be perfect. Our human family may not always demonstrate any love, much less Divine love. We may be rejected by or reject our human family.

But we are part of God's family. We are part of a family whose essence is perfect, self-giving love. We can know no greater love than this love we demonstrate by serving others.
