The Beginning of Wisdom

1/28/2024

Psalm 111

"The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom."

That is the truth! You are wise to fear the LORD. The LORD can call you right now, this very minute, and if you are a sinner, He will throw you into the fires of hell. You will be weeping, wailing, and gnashing teeth. If you are smart, you will fear the LORD and do whatever the LORD tells you. Straighten up and fly right!

Many interpret this phrase like this. Be afraid of the LORD because he holds your eternal life in his hands. But that is not what this phrase means. In fact, the meaning of the phrase is far from that interpretation. To understand the phrase, we must break it down.

First, what is meant by fear? Does fear mean to be afraid of the LORD? No, far from it. Fear means to be in awe of the greatness of God. Look at what the psalmist says earlier. "Great are the works of the LORD." "Full of honor and majesty is his work, and his righteousness endures forever." "The LORD is gracious and merciful." "He provides food for those who fear him." "He has shown his people the power of his works." "The works of his hands are faithful and just." Those words do not sound like someone who wants you to be scared of them. In fact, it sounds more like someone who wants you to approach them.

We approach the LORD with reverence. We recognize his holiness and our unholiness. With awe and reverence, we are drawn closer to God to be cleansed and made holy. We begin the path towards wisdom.

Then what is wisdom? Is wisdom knowing all of the laws and obeying the laws? The ability to make the right decisions is a component of wisdom, but it is not wisdom. The wisdom that comes from the fear of the LORD is the desire to follow and imitate God. Wisdom is our desire to obey God. As Albert Edward Day, the Methodist pastor and writer wrote, "Obedience is indispensable. *Not to a static code,* however helpful it may be at times. *But to obedience to God,* who is present with us in every situation and is speaking to us all the time."¹

Wisdom is not obedience to the law but to God. Wisdom is the desire to follow, obey, and imitate God. Wisdom is responding to the presence of God now, and the word God is speaking to us today. God did not stop speaking with the completion of the Bible but is speaking to us today. Wisdom is listening and responding to God's word today. Wisdom is prayer, study, and listening to discern God's call for us as individuals and as the church.

Complete wisdom is not fearing the LORD. Before you start claiming I am contradicting myself, look at the phrase again. "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom."

While our awe and reverence of the LORD is wise, it does not give us wisdom. Wisdom comes from continually working to follow and imitate God. We are not made holy because we fear the LORD, but we begin the process of becoming holy. As we continue to follow, obey, and imitate the LORD, we increase in wisdom. This process of increasing in wisdom and holiness is the way of salvation.

This week, I found this little pamphlet attached to the Gunter Circle mailbox. It presents an ABC salvation. A is admitting that you are a sinner. B is believing in what Jesus has done for you. He died for your sins. C is calling upon Jesus now.

I don't know about the group that placed these pamphlets, but many believe that is all one needs to do to be saved. I agree to an extent. I agree that these ABCs are the **beginning** of salvation, wisdom if you will. But salvation, wisdom, does not end there. Salvation comes from continually striving to grow in wisdom. We desire to follow God more closely.

The ABCs may keep us out of hell, but they do not draw us closer to heaven. Marcrina Wiederkehr wrote, "We became so busy keeping out of hell that we forgot we are on the way to heaven."² We go on to heaven by growing in our desire to follow God more closely, obeying God's call for us today, and being as close an imitation of God as we can be.

Our fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom. Accepting Jesus as our Savior is the beginning of our salvation. May we continue to grow in wisdom. May we grow in our desire to follow and imitate God through the example of Jesus. Each day, we take a step closer to heaven.
