Easter is traditionally a time of joy, but in this year's Easter Cantata we will also look at the despair that the followers of Jesus experienced before that first Easter dawned upon them. We will look back with them at the memories and reflections of their life with Jesus. We'll share the impact of his death before coming to the joy of new life through his spirit, which brought them, as it will bring us, from despair to joy, which is the theme of this year's Easter Cantata. The Sacraments 3/3/2024

Acts 8: 34- 39 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26

This Sunday is unusual because we celebrate the Sacraments the United Methodist Church recognizes: Baptism and Holy Communion. These sacraments are ordained by Christ's baptism and final meal with the disciples.

The Sacraments are means of grace. They are outward signs of God's grace and ways we experience God's grace. The Sacraments point out that this is God's grace in action.

Baptism points to God's prevenient grace, which surrounds all from birth. It is a sign of one's adoption into the family of God, the Church. It is a sign of God's justifying grace and forgiveness of sin. It is a sign of the beginning of one's journey toward Holiness. It is a sign that God is doing what we cannot, saving ourselves from sin. This reality is seen in the baptism of infants. Like an infant must rely on others for protection and survival, we must rely on God for our protection and survival. Baptism is the sign of God's pouring grace upon us throughout our lives.

Holy Communion, the Eucharist, the Lord's Supper, whichever term you wish to use, is a sign of God's grace working through Jesus. Communion is a remembrance of Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection. It is more than a mere remembrance; it is a sign of our sharing in Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, becoming a holy and living sacrifice. We join in union with Christ as we partake of the bread and wine. Since there is one loaf and one cup, we are one body. Since we are one body there is a time of reconciliation during the service, the passing of the peace. We give thanks to God for the mighty acts of creation, the atoning act of the Son, and the sanctifying acts of the Holy Spirit. Through communion, we are made one with Christ and with each other.

We have experienced the sign of God's grace through baptism. May we continue to experience God's grace as we come to the Lord's Table.
