Getting our lives on GOD's calendar

Of course if you can read this then you are well aware of it being another new year. We call it 2015. Now, you may not know that most of the world operates time and planning according to the Gregorian calendar. This way of keeping time and dates is almost as old as the dirt is in our back yards. GOD too, has ways to keep time and they are not our ways. In other words, if we were to ask the LORD GOD Almighty right now what time is it, the answer would not be 2015, for time in heaven or the scripture is not kept the way most of the human race has kept it.

We could learn some things from our Jewish friends if we wanted to see how time is kept in accordance to what GOD originally said to Moses about it. According to the Jewish calendar it is the year 5575 now. I'm attempting to un-complicate something that is unknown to most North American "gentile" believers who have little knowledge of the Jewish roots of their faith. In doing so I've probably only succeeded in confusing you about something that you were not confused about at all until I started this newsletter article. If you are confused now, just read this. "The western sense of time is basically the measurement of linear, progressive motion, but in Hebrew thinking, time is seen as an ascending helix, with recurring patterns or cycles that present a thematic message or revelation of sacred history. Indeed, part of being Jewish today is to be mindful or this divinely ordered spiral of time and to order our affairs accordingly." There!!! Now, can you see what I'm talking about? Some of you are probably thinking, "I have no idea what you are talking about!" Seriously, this subject matter is new to most of us in the North American Church. We have not known to seriously consider what the LORD may have to say to us through the lens of a Jewish practice of keeping time or any consideration of their holidays which all point to the Messiah, JESUS CHRIST. Many of us will travel through our life knowing very little about the seven major festivals most Jews observe to remember the basic tenants of their faith values. Without reference to any of them now, except to say Passover is the primary one that most Christians know a little about, there are many truths to the faith and what we could study or prioritize this new year to help us know what our Heavenly Father is concerned about.

As concerned as the LORD GOD is about us, He is also concerned that we discover what GOD is concerned with this New Year. Here are three issues we could look further into that may assist us in days ahead. First, GOD is ultimately our provider. When other resources fall apart the LORD will not. Exactly whom are we looking at for our sustenance and provision in the days ahead? Second, GOD is a forgiving GOD and most of HIS children know very little about how divine and forgiving the LORD really is. If you have a very elementary undeveloped sparse view and practice of forgiveness your days ahead could be very tough for you. Those who know how to walk in forgiveness will be protected from many personal conflicts that otherwise one could suffer much anguish from un-forgiveness issues. And third, times are changing and those who cannot handle change will not be able to handle reality or life challenges. The local church for many has become a place to be protected from the reality of change rather than it being a place that promotes the transforming grace of JESUS CHRIST through repentance as we continue to follow the LORD. The only way to have a blessed New Year is to realize we must continue to walk in the newness of the life of JESUS CHRIST always. Blessings in HIM for the New Year!!!

The Program is...

- 10 weeks in length; class will meet on Monday and Wednesday from 4:30 5:30
- Activities include balance, strengthening, aerobics & stretching exercises
- Student clinicians provide assistance, feedback & balance support
- Pre- and post-assessments are used to monitor changes/improvements
- Assessment results are shared with participants at the end of the program
- All activities are tailored to the individual from beginning to advanced levels
