The net proceeds of just over \$76,000 have been applied to the principal balance of our mortgage. This reduced the balance to approximately \$60,350. Reaching New People

During the presentation made to the congregation on Sunday, April 10, quite a few statistics were presented. Here are some of the highlights:

At Trinity UMC:

- Trinity began with 30 charter members in 1960.
- In 2005, we hit our highest membership number—352.
- At the end of 2015 we had 284 members.
- Average attendance at worship declined from an average of 118 to <u>60</u> last year.

Nationwide:

- Only 19% of the US population attend church weekly
- In SC, only 22.2% attend church weekly.
- In the 18-22 age group, 70% drop out of church, never to return.
- Between 1990 and 2010, 125,000 churches closed.
- The percentage of churches experiencing decline is **80%**.
- Only 2% of church members EVER invite anyone to come to church.

These numbers represent a call to action to us at Trinity and we've begun a process to help us Reach New People so that we can better fulfill our mission to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." And, we can make sure we are continually striving to reach our vision of helping people "Connect, Nurture, Inspire and Transform."

Because 20% of churches are thriving we're trying to learn from their best practices and will be focusing on the following:

- 1. <u>Seek Help From Specialists</u>—we've joined the Coaching Cluster sponsored by Nickerson Consulting and have submitted our plan to them. We will be receiving 24/7 support from them via e-mail, text and conference calls as well as receiving continuing education from them.
- 2. <u>Introduce Ourselves to the Community</u>—we'll be finding new ways to be more visible and involved in our community. Things like relocating our meetings to public places, connecting with community-wide events, and conducting events in the public arena, not at church will become the norm.
- 3. <u>Change the Expectations for the Pastor's Time</u>—Pastor Donna will be leading by example and getting out into the community more. This will require us to help her reallocate 8 hours of her time each week to be spent networking with community organizations.
- 4. <u>Change the Expectations of the Congregation</u>—We'll be looking at the ways we take care of our congregation so that more of that work falls on the congregation and not just on the pastor. We'll also focus on developing new ways to invite people to join us at Trinity and we'll learn how to more effectively reach out to those who don't attend church.
- 5. <u>Develop a Plan and Stick to It</u>—At the seminar attended by Pastor Donna, Rusty Poole, Linda Maloch and Jeanette Hornsby we started a plan. We've fleshed it out a little more and there are copies on the table in the Gathering Area if you're interested in seeing some of the things we'll be doing. We also held a Training Session on April 30 to get a better picture of our community and learn how to invite people into our congregation. We'll be focusing on a few specific things each month so watch the GLIA and the bulletin each Sunday.

What can you do?

Pray—for our church, it's purpose and your part in it! Change is not easy and we need God's help in helping us change the way we do things to bring about the changes that will be needed to make this work.

Get out in the community yourself—think about ways you can impact the lives of those you encounter in your everyday lives!

<u>INVITE</u>—as someone who already has a church background to come to church or a church event—don't be a part of that 2%!
