Hymns

One of the things we all have missed during the past sixteen months has been singing hymns together. Everyone raising their voices in praise to God tends to bring us all together as a community. With the majority of the congregation vaccinated, we are now able to return to congregational singing and saying the creeds and prayers as a community. Whether we sing like an operatic diva or a dying bullfrog, we all look forward to raising our voices in song.

During this time we have not been singing, I have been reading the hymns more as poetry rather than songs. Songs are poems set to music. I noticed that sometimes the musical breaks differ from the punctuation breaks in a song. For example, we sing: "Hark the herald angels sing" as one line when it is "Hark! The herald angels sing," This indicates a pause between "Hark" and "The herald angels sing" while we sing them together. At times, I notice a slightly different meaning as I read the song instead of singing.

Also, as we sing we become more focused on the music. We listen more for the notes and rhythm rather than the words. How many times have you thought you knew the words of a song, then read the lyrics. We may sing the song but not think about the meaning of the words.

Many hymns are full of theology, particularly the hymns of Charles Wesley. Some have said that as much of Methodist theology may be found in the hymns of Charles Wesly as there are in the sermons of John Wesley. Come, Sinners, to the Gospel Feast and Come, Let Us Use the Grace Divine speak to Methodist theology of the sacraments. I Want a Principle Within speaks to the doctrine of Christian Perfection. Other hymns also are expressions of doctrine and theology. *Come*, Thou Almighty King is a celebration of the doctrine of the

As we go back to singing, take time to read the hymns before the service starts. Separate the words from the music, then put them together. The hymns are selected to match the theme of the scripture readings and the sermon. While we sing, listen to both the music and the words to receive the lesson that the writer of the hymn has for you.
