John's Jottings The Empty Tomb

The following story is condensed from "The Story of Phillip" by Harry Pritchett, Jr. in *St Luke's Journal of Theology* (June 1976) found in *A Guide to Prayer for All God's People* By Rueben P. Job and Norman Sawchuck, (Nashville: Upper Room Books, 1990) 327-329.

Phillip was a happy pleasant child, but Phillip was born with Down's Syndrome. As Phillip got older, he became increasingly aware of the difference between himself and other children.

Phillip attended Sunday school at a Methodist church with nine other 8-year-old children. The class was a close-knit group that cared about each other. With his differences, Phillip was not readily accepted as a member of the class. The teacher could see that Phillip was not completely accepted because he was different. One

Easter the teacher had a marvelous plan for the Sunday school lesson. He brought in ten of the pantyhose containers that were shaped like large eggs. It was a beautiful spring day. Each child was given an "egg", Their assignment was to go outside on the church grounds, find a symbol of new life, put it in the "egg" and bring it back to the classroom. Needless to say, it was wild. The children ran all over the church grounds finding their symbols and bringing them back to the classroom. After all ten "eggs" were on the table, the children gathered while the teacher began to open the "eggs".

The first "egg" contained a flower and they all oohed and aahed. In the second "egg" was a little butterfly. The next "egg" contained a rock. The children laughed and said, "A rock, how is that supposed to be new life."

The smart little boy whose "egg" it was said, "I knew you would get flowers and buds and stuff like that. I wanted to be different and for me, that is new life." The teacher opened the next "egg" and there was nothing in it. "That's stupid! Somebody didn't do it right!" cried the children.

The teacher felt a tug on his shirt. He looked down and Phillip was standing beside him. "It's mine," Phillip said, "It's mine." The other children cried, "You don't ever do things right, Phillip. There is nothing there!"

"I did so do it", Phillip said, "I did do it. It's empty- *the tomb is empty*." A silence fell over the classroom, a very full silence. From that time on things were different in that class. Phillip became a part of that group of 8-year-old children, He was set free from the tomb of his differentness.

Phillip died the summer after that Easter. He died from an infection that most children would have shrugged off. He was buried from that church. At the funeral nine 8-year-olds, with their Sunday school teacher, marched up to the altar and laid on it an empty "egg"- an empty discarded holder of pantyhose.

The empty tomb empties us from all our differentness, freeing us for new life.
