### **Combating Sin**

As Christians, we are on the front lines of the fight against sin and evil. We receive the same commission that the first disciples received in Matthew 28: 19-20: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. (NRSV)." We are to overcome sin and evil and bring God's Kingdom to fruition.

How are we to overcome sin and evil and bring God's kingdom to fruition? Perhaps we can use force. I do not mean violence but just continually getting in people's faces. We ask everyone we meet if they know Jesus then tell them about Jesus before they can answer. Perhaps we can use fear. A little hellfire and brimstone may scare people into turning away from sin and evil. Let people know that if they continue sinning they are going to burn in the fires of hell for eternity.

However, there are problems with using force and fear to overcome sin and evil. Force and fear coerce people into doing what the one wielding the force and fear wants them to do. Coercion is the way of evil powers so any method that coerces cannot bring about God's kingdom. While force and fear may lead one to say they repent, their repentance does not come from the soul. Force and fear do not make disciples of Jesus Christ.

If force and fear are not means of overcoming sin and evil, what is? Since sin and evil are antithetical to the Kingdom of God, what is the opposite of force and fear? The opposite of force and fear is humble love. Kallistos Ware, a Greek Orthodox theologian, relates, "Loving humility is a terrible force: it is the strongest of all things, and there is nothing else like it."1

Humble love overcomes all force and fear. Greg lived in a Christian community that believed in racial equality. During his senior year in high school, he was ostracized for befriending the Afro-American student that integrated the high school. One day he was challenged by T.J. to a fight after school. As he went to his car, he was confronted by T. J. and others. Greg told T.J. he did not want to fight but T.J. hit him, knocking him to the ground. Greg got up, lip bleeding, and said, "T.J., I love you and am not going to fight you." T.J. dropped his hands, unclenched his fists, and walked away.

When we wonder how to overcome sin and evil, the most powerful way, the only way, is humble love. To quote Ware once again, "Always decide: 'I will combat it (sin) by humble love.' If you resolve on that once for all, you can conquer the whole world.2"
