Looking Back, Looking Forward

Wow, a new year is upon us. A new year is a time for reflection, looking back at the previous year. I hope we reflect upon 2022 and the events that transformed our lives. As a church, the new year is a time to reflect upon the events of 2022. Let's look back and see what has happened at Trinity.

Twenty-twenty-two may well go down as the year of grief. We lost fifteen members of the Trinity family to death. Some of these were expected after a long illness. Some were unexpected but not surprising, given the person's age or health. Some were tragic, unexpected deaths that shook us to the core.

We may also grieve the loss of many of our activities. While we tried to get Lunch Bunch, Wonderful Wednesday, and movies restarted, the participation was not enough to sustain these activities. We may grieve over the number of empty pews we see on Sunday mornings. Our average in-person attendance has been 28. When the CoVid pandemic hit, we were averaging 63 per Sunday. We grieve that people are not coming back as we may have hoped.

However, there was also much joy. We baptized Everly and Lyla Faye Branham in March. Two new members joined Trinity by transfer of membership. Our online presence increased as we live-streamed Sunday morning services on YouTube. This enabled us to reach those unable to come in person. Also, people could participate later if they were not able Sunday Morning. We averaged 18 views on YouTube which, using the formula from the Conference, translates to about 32 participants per Sunday. When combined with in-person participants, we are close to pre-pandemic attendance.

Not only have we live-streamed services, but we have also live-streamed studies and funerals. This has enabled family members who were unable to attend to be at a loved one's funeral. Chuck Martin's aunt wrote about feeling she was at Chuck's service even though she was in Arizona. The grief discussion we held was attended by 14 people and had 41 views on YouTube. The Advent studies had as many as 32 views. Our livestream capabilities have allowed us to get the message of Jesus Christ beyond the walls of the church.

In March we began a study of the Wesley Class Meetings which evolved into the first T.a.G. (Transformation and Growth) group. The members of the group will all attest that they have grown stronger in their faith and closer to God's perfect love through the group. Also, our financial situation remains good at present.

After looking back, we turn and look forward to 2023. We are starting an ongoing grief support in response to the grief discussion. Interest has been expressed in starting a second T.a.G. group which would meet during the day. We are beginning to explore changing to a simplified organizational structure. This new structure would help us to evaluate and be more effective in our ministries. We will begin a mentor-based confirmation program for our youth.

As we move forward, the church council concurred that our focus for 2023 will be on prayer. We will pray for the future of Trinity. The Sunday School class will study prayer and praying. There will be studies on different types of prayer. We may start small prayer groups and church-wide intercessory prayer. (More on this to come.)

The new year may bring on changes in the Church. Times of change provoke anxiety. Pray for God's guidance as we look forward to great things at Trinity in 2023.
