John's Jotting

Sound of Silence

We have become accustomed to many noises. We experience much ambient noise - the ticking of a clock, car engines, sirens, airplanes, and other motorized gadgets - that we don't really notice the noise. Many stores have music playing while you shop. Many of us turn on the television, radio, or stereo just to have some background noise. When we make a call and are put on hold, we listen to music along with a recording telling us how important our call is.

We hear so much noise that we rarely experience silence. We probably experience so much noise that we become uncomfortable with silence. In conversations, we feel uncomfortable with silence. We feel like we must say something to keep the conversation going. We have become so accustomed to noise, that we do not like silence.

Then there is internal noise. Our thoughts are racing with everything we have to do. We stress about work, school, children, and grandchildren. We worry about our health. External and internal noise surrounds us. With so much noise, how can we hear God's voice?

In 1 Kings 19, the prophet Elijah is fleeing from Queen Jezebel. He has decided to give up and prays to die. He cannot hear God amidst the noise of Jezebel's threats and his fear. The LORD tells Elijah to go to Mt. Horeb, the mountain of God. God sustains Elijah throughout the journey. The LORD tells Elijah to stand on the mountain, for the LORD is going to pass by.

Elijah experiences a strong wind that breaks rocks into pieces, but the LORD is not in the wind. Then comes a mighty earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. Next comes a fire (the Hebrew actually reads the stench of fire), but the LORD was not in the fire or smoke. The LORD did not speak to Elijah by any of these noisy means.

Elijah hears the LORD in a "still, small voice" (KJV, RSV). Others translate this phrase as the "sound of sheer silence" (NRSV), "a gentle whisper" (NIV), a "sound, thin, quiet" (CEB), or "a gentle blowing" (NASB). The Hebrew could also be translated as "sheer, thin, calm." All these translations denote a sense of quiet, gentle, calm, delicate, barely a sound. It is in this quiet, delicate, calm, almost silent sound we hear the voice of the LORD.

Some of my most holy moments with people have been in times of silence. The most therapeutic act was sitting in silence with a client after some insight, letting the revelation soak in. A young woman with stage four cancer spent half an hour grieving her losses, particularly not seeing her son graduate from high school. All I could do was sit with her in silence. In the silence, I knew the presence of God was with me.

We do not hear God's voice or feel God's presence in the noise, wind, earthquakes, or fires in our lives. We hear God or feel God's presence when we are quiet, calm, and still. Then we can feel the gentle whisper, the thin, quiet sound of God. We may not necessarily hear God's voice audibly, but we may experience God's presence in the sound of silence.

Try sitting in silence for five minutes away from the external noise. Let the internal noise flow from you. At first, this may seem like a long time. It may take that long to clear the internal noise. Increase the time in silence as you wish and are able. While you may not hear the voice of God, you will experience God's presence and peace. You will be better able to deal with the noise of the world.
