# John's Jottings

#### **My Dream**

A few nights ago, I had a dream. I dreamt I was at church. The setup of the church was more like an arena. The pulpit and altar area were in the center, and there was stadium-type seating around the altar area. Communion was being served by intinction.

I was wearing a white robe with my stole and usual clerical accouterments. I was one of the last to go to receive communion. A young lady and I approached the table at the same time. I gestured for her to go ahead of me. The woman serving the bread quickly covered it and began carrying it away as I approached the table.

I said, "Wait, I haven't been served.

She replied, "I cannot serve you."

"Why not?", I asked as I was confused. I knew no reason I should not receive communion.

She shrugged her shoulders stating, "I don't know. I was told not to."

Becoming a little angry, I said, "Could someone tell me why"

Seeming a little embarrassed, she said she would find somebody.

Time passed, and they began setting up for the second service while I stewed. Finally, a man wearing a black robe came and asked what he could do for me. I told him I wanted to know why I was not served communion. Without making eye contact, the man said, "We needed to make sure we had enough."

What? I yelled, you mean to tell me you do not think God's grace is limited so you could not offer me a little piece of bread which it represents. That's (at this point I said some unpastorly things)!"

The man said, "I'm sorry." And quickly walked away.

I yelled at him, "I am not leaving here unless I am served communion or given a reasonable explanation why I can't be served!" At this point, the scene shifted. I was alone, lying on a pew, asleep, still waiting.

Then the alarm went off. I hit snooze and went back to sleep. Now, I was standing outside the church with a sign, leading a protest against the church. I was telling people not to go there as they treated people unfairly. I had others with me that the church did not welcome. I was beyond angry. I was shouting at people as they entered the church. When I woke, I was so angry.

Why did I have this dream? I have never been in a situation where I was excluded and rejected for no rational reason. I think God was sending me a gift, to be able to truly empathize with someone who was rejected for no reason. I understood the shame and anger felt by those who were excluded and rejected because of their race, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation or other barrier. I understood Richard Allen, who formed the African Methodist Episcopal Church after he was refused communion at a Philadelphia Methodist Church because he was black. I understood (to a degree) the protesters of the Civil Rights Movement, Stonewall, and other acts of protest.

Throughout history, people have been excluded. But exclusion is not the way of Christ. Jesus included all, even the most despised. It is time for us as a church, a society, and a nation to quit being exclusive and include all. God sets no reason for exclusion, should we?
